

ANNUAL BIOMETRIC SCREENING

The 2021 annual biometric screening will be held on July 14th sfrom 7:30am - 8:30am Labette Center is offering a free health screening to staff covered under Labette Center's BC/BS medical policy. This health screening is Labette Health free and voluntary. staff will be on site at the main building to provide this benefit to LCMHS employees. The results of the screening will provide employees with an assessment of height, weight, body composition, blood pressure, fasting glucose, total cholesterol, LDL and HDL cholesterol and triglycerides.

The sign up sheet for the biometric screening is located in the resource room in the main building.

CHANGES TO BCBS INSURANCE

As of July 1st, Labette Center's BCBS insurance plan has changed for those staff enrolled in a HDHP (High Deductible Health Plan). The deductible amount for this plan has increased from \$3000.00 to \$5000.00 for a single plan and from \$6000.00 to \$10,000.00 for plans with dependants.

Staff who are enrolled in the HDHP medical plan qualify to participate in Labette Center for Mental Health Services Health Reimbursement Arrangement (HRA). The HRA will reimburse the last \$2,000 if enrolled in

single coverage, and the last \$4,000 if dependents are enrolled on the plan, therefore covering the difference in the increase in deductible.

In order to receive reimbursement, employees will need to submit an Explanation of Benefits (EOB), and a claim form to an outside agency for reimbursement. This agency, Surency, will then handle the case for the reimbursement for the claim.
